

Promoting Peace and Security through Religious Tolerance: Lessons from Uzbekistan

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ABSTRACT

In this regard, the Mu‘tazilites supported freedom of thought, particularly an individual's right to choose matters of religion and belief. Likewise, in his renowned work *Ta‘wilat Ahl al-Sunnah*, Abu Mansur al-Maturidi interprets the Qur’anic concept of haqq (truth and justice) and specifically emphasizes the prohibition of destroying churches and synagogues. According to al-Maturidi, this principle was observed for a long period within Muslim societies, and no significant conflicts concerning this issue arose between Muslims and the protected non-Muslim communities (ahl al-dhimma). These views demonstrate that the principles of religious tolerance, justice, and respect for religious diversity have deep roots within Islamic intellectual and theological traditions [4].

The renowned jurist and Qur’anic commentator from Samarkand, Abu al-Layth al-Samarqandi, in his exegetical work *Bahr al-Ulum*, while interpreting verses 8–9 of Surah Al-Mumtahanah, emphasizes that Muslims must uphold justice even in situations of conflict with followers of other religions. According to his interpretation,

non-Muslims should be treated fairly and humanely in all circumstances, and they should not be subjected to enslavement or oppression during disputes or hostilities. Furthermore, the distinguished Qur'anic exegete Abdullah ibn Ahmad al-Nasafi, in his celebrated commentary *Madarik al-Tanzil wa Haqa'iq al-Ta'wil*, explains these verses as a call for Muslims to demonstrate respect toward followers of other faiths and to treat them with kindness, benevolence, and goodwill in both word and deed. These interpretations highlight the principles of justice, compassion, and religious tolerance that occupy an important place within Islamic thought and tradition [5].

Likewise, Abu Mansur al-Maturidi, in his Qur'anic commentaries, notes that Christians have often demonstrated kindness and goodwill toward Muslims throughout history. Expanding upon this perspective, Abu al-Barakat al-Nasafi emphasizes that Muslims have traditionally maintained sincere, respectful, and friendly relations with followers of other religions. According to his interpretation, mutual understanding, compassion, and constructive interaction among people of different faiths constitute important principles for preserving social harmony and peaceful coexistence. These views illustrate that interreligious respect and tolerance have long been regarded as essential values within the Islamic intellectual tradition [7].

People across the world adhere to different religions, and even within a single nation there may be considerable diversity in religious beliefs and practices. As emphasized in both scholarly and religious sources, ensuring stability, harmony, and peaceful coexistence among individuals of different faiths remains one of the most pressing challenges of contemporary society. This is largely because religious teachings generally promote belief in a Supreme Being, social solidarity, tolerance, honesty, justice, and moral integrity. Such universal values serve as important instruments for fostering mutual understanding, respect, and closer relationships among individuals, communities, and nations, thereby contributing to social cohesion, peace, and sustainable development.
